correspondence documenting a jewish family s personal history of the holocaust and world war ii raya schapiro and helga weinberg found a box of letters among their mother s effects after her death in 1990 they were written by their grandmother and uncle trapped in prague after the nazi occupation to the girls parents who had escaped to the united states in may 1939 leaving behind raya and helga who were five and seven years old at the time the seventy seven letters reprinted here span a period of two years during which the nazis drew an ever tightening noose of destruction around the jews of prague each letter is followed by notes of explanation and amplification as well as notes on nazi

laws and official restrictions and the progress of the war each letter has a censor's stamp on it each envelope bears the still frightening emblem of the third reich the letters dramatically convey the tension growing daily of existence under the nazis and their tone becomes increasingly desperate as every avenue of escape reaches a dead end praise for letters from prague 1939 1941 this book turns an abstraction into a palpable terror and pity chicago tribune a compelling and personal insight into the horrors of the holocaust booklist as it turned out the girls escaped only after months of bureaucratic wrangling while the grandmother and uncle never obtained permission to leave and were deported to the gas chambers at treblinka and auschwitz two years later collected here is the moving correspondence between the adults in prague and the girls' parents in the u s publishers weekly

the munich crisis of 1938 in which great britain and france decided to appease hitler's demands to annex the sudetenland has provoked a vast amount of historical writing the era has been thoroughly examined from the perspectives of germans french and british political establishments but historians have had until now only a vague understanding of the roles played by the soviet union and czechoslovakia the country whose very existence was at the very center of the crisis in czechoslovakia between stalin and hitler igor lukes explores this turbulent and tragic era from the new perspective of the prague government itself at the center of this study is edvard benes a czechoslovak foreign policy strategist and a major player in the political machinations of the era the work looks at the first two decades of benes's diplomacy and analyzes the prague government's attempts to secure the existence of the republic of czechoslovakia in the treacherous space between the millstones of the east and west it studies benes's relationship with joseph stalin outlines the role assigned to czechoslovak communists by the viith congress of the communist international in 1935 and dissects prague's secret negotiations with berlin and benes's role in the famous tukhachevsky affair the work also brings evidence regarding the so called partial mobilization of the czechoslovak army in may 1938 and focuses on stalin's strategic thinking on the eve of the world war ii until the fall of the berlin wall it was difficult for western researchers to gain access to the rich archival collections of the east czechoslovakia between stalin and hitler makes ample use of these secret archives both in prague and in russia as a result it is an accurate and original rendition of the events which eventually sparked the second world war

prior to hitler's occupation nearly 120 000 jews inhabited the areas that would become the protectorate of bohemia and moravia by 1945 all but a handful had either escaped or been deported and murdered by the nazis this pioneering study gives a definitive account of the holocaust as it was carried out in the region detailing the german and czech policies including previously overlooked measures such as small town ghettoization and forced labor that shaped jewish life drawing on extensive new evidence wolf gruner demonstrates how the persecution of the jews as well as their

reactions and resistance efforts were the result of complex actions by german authorities in prague and berlin as well as the czech government and local authorities
